Does the DRC take housing cases?

The DRC may be able to help you if you are experiencing discrimination in housing due to a disability, such as:

...Your landlord refuses to make reasonable accommodations for your disability

...You are threatened with eviction due to your disability

...A landlord refuses to rent to you due to your disability or that of a family member

You can file a complaint online or by phone or mail. Complaints must be filed within one year after an alleged discriminatory housing practice has occurred or terminated.
